### **North Orange County Community College District Trustee M. Tony Ontiveros Elected to California Community College Trustees Board**

**Anaheim, Calif.** – M. Tony Ontiveros, a member of the North Orange County Community College District (NOCCCD) Board of Trustees, has been elected to serve a three-year term on the California Community College Trustees (CCCT) Board.

Ontiveros was elected to serve on the 21-member board of the CCCT by the local governing boards of the state's 72 community college districts. Ontiveros first began serving on the CCCT Board late last year after being appointed to fill a vacated seat.

"It is an honor to be elected by my state-wide peers and colleagues to the CCCT Board," said Ontiveros. "There are many important decisions to be made in the months and years ahead as we face unprecedented economic challenges. I'm happy that our college district will have a voice, and I'm ready to do the extra homework to make sure ours is an informed voice, with the good of all in mind."

Ontiveros also emphasized that the state's community colleges provide ready training for people and employers that need to prepare for new jobs. "Our local communities and state lawmakers are recognizing this more all of the time," he said. "Community colleges are part of the solution today."

Action is taken at CCCT Board meetings on education policy issues before the state Board of Governors and the Legislature. Policy direction also is provided to staff concerning state-wide educational policy, research initiatives, publications, workshops, and conferences.

Others whose election to the CCCT Board was announced this week are: Janet Chanot of Mendocino-Lake, Bernard Jones of Allan Hancock, Jeanette Mann of Pasadena, Douglas Otto of Long Beach, Christopher Stampolis of West Valley-Mission, and Marcia Zableckis of Barstow.

Ontiveros was re-elected to a third, four-year term on the NOCCCD Board last November. He has served on the Board since March 1999 when he was appointed to complete the term of a trustee who was elected to county office. Ontiveros has served as President, Vice President, and Secretary of the NOCCCD Board. He additionally has served as a trustee representative on District committees and task force groups, including the Orange County Community Colleges Legislative Task Force. This task force is a unique collaborative effort of the county's four community college districts to address legislative issues impacting the districts, colleges, and students.

Ontiveros is a Federal Probation Officer and an Adjunct Professor of Political Science. He also is a member of Anaheim Beautiful, Anaheim Arts Council, and Anaheim Sister Cities Association. He has served as a board member for the Anaheim Independencia Community Center and as a commissioner for Anaheim Parks and Recreation, and the Orange County Human Relations Commission. Additionally, Ontiveros has been a frequent presenter at the annual Community College League Conference, attended by trustee and college representatives from across the state.

During Ontiveros' service as a trustee, the NOCCCD Board has provided leadership for a number of major District accomplishments. Among them is Measure X, a \$238-million facilities bond program that, approved by voters in 2002, is nearing completion today at the Anaheim Campus, Cypress College, and Fullerton College. Another major accomplishment has been development of the first District-wide Strategic Plan as well as renewal of accreditation for the colleges and establishment of accreditation for the District's School of Continuing Education (known as SCE).

**NOCCCD Background**

Two of the state's premiere colleges and most extensive continuing education program combine to provide the quality educational programming of the NOCCCD. Nearly 70,000 students enroll each term at Cypress College, Fullerton College, and the School of Continuing Education. College students are able to shape their futures in programs leading to associate degrees, vocational certificates, and transfer opportunities. Life-long learning also is possible in continuing education programs that range from high school completion and basic skills mastery through an array of vocational training and self-development courses.
