The committee discussed revising the meeting format to return to in-person meetings at the Anaheim Campus, while continuing to provide a Zoom option for public access.

**XI. Discussion**

**A. Disparate Impact Study to validate “Audition” as Course Prerequisites**

Discussion was held regarding the use of an audition as a course prerequisite, rather than as an advisory, for certain performance-based courses. The Cypress College Curriculum Chair raised the importance of ensuring any such practice is reviewed considering the State’s DEIAA-related curricular compliance expectations, particularly as it may affect student access. It was also agreed that Title 5 should take precedence over local approval practices when determining whether such prerequisites are appropriate and defensible. While the final determination would remain with each respective campus, the matter was brought to DCCC to promote alignment, awareness, and districtwide consideration. The core issue discussed was whether an audition may appropriately be used to assess whether a student possesses the baseline skill necessary to participate successfully in programs such as theatre or athletics.

**B. TOP to CIP Code Transition**

The committee received an update on the State’s ongoing **TOP-to-CIP crosswalk development**, which was reported to be progressing well. Clarification was provided that **TOP codes continue to serve as the CTE designation**, while **CIP codes themselves do not inherently indicate CTE status**, creating concern where available CIP options may not adequately capture certain instructional areas. The State continues to solicit feedback and has requested that comments be submitted by **March 31, 2026**. The DCCC Chair recommended that campuses also begin developing **local crosswalks** to help inform related impacts in areas such as **facilities, fiscal operations, payroll, and human resources**. It was further noted that **Cypress College** and **Fullerton College** will work collaboratively to align code usage across the district, and that future coding decisions may carry broader implications, including potential effects on **funding**.

**C. Courshedog Update**

Implementation efforts for the new system continue. It was noted that **Rocketlane** has not been broadly well received by the campuses, and that the highly technical nature of many meetings to date has made it difficult to connect that work to the broader curriculum process. In response, **District Information Services** has been engaged to help facilitate those discussions, and each campus has identified **campus-specific technical leads** to assist in interpreting and supporting the work. The DCCC Chair also confirmed that contact has been made with **CurricUNET** regarding retrieval of district curriculum data, and assurance was given that no decision to discontinue use of CurricUNET will occur until district data has been returned and secured internally. Weekly meetings will continue at both the **campus level** and with **Courshedog** to support progress and implementation milestones.
