The North Orange County Community College District (NOCCCD) is one of the premiere community college districts in California, providing quality education to more than \$63,129 students. The District includes two award-winning credit colleges – Cypress College and Fullerton College – as well as one of the largest noncredit institutions in the state – North Orange Continuing Education.

Led by Chancellor Byron D. Clift Breland, NOCCCD employs 2,800 people and adds more than \$2 billion in income to the Orange County economy. Between the three campuses, NOCCCD offers 412 certificate programs and 230 degrees, making it the largest institution for higher education in North Orange County.



Billion Added Income

In FY 2023-24, NOCCCD added **\$2.7** billion in income to the Orange County economy, a value approximately equal to 0.9% of the county's total gross regional product (GRP).
