SUBJECT:	Public Hearing and Add Categorical Program Flo Resolution	•	_		
BACKGROUND : In response to the State's fiscal crisis, major budget revisions were signed into law on July 28, 2009. Amongst these revisions was a categorical flexibility provision providing districts with greater flexibility in managing State categorical program funding reductions. Under the flexibility provision, districts are allowed to redirect funds from certain categorical programs to support any other categorical program funded in the State budget. This flexibility applies to fiscal years 2009-10 through 2014-15. In addition, for the 2009-10 through 2014-15 fiscal years, any district electing to exercise the flexibility provision shall be deemed to be in compliance with the program and funding requirements contained in statutory, regulatory, and provisional language associated with the specified programs to which the flexibility provisions apply. Therefore, it is recommended that the Board adopt a resolution authorizing the transfer of one dollar (\$1) from the Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) program to the Disabled Students Programs & Services (DSP&S) program.

Protection Account Funding and Expenditures

BACKGROUND: Proposition 30, The Schools and Local Public Safety Protection Act of 2012 passed in November 2012. This proposition temporarily raised the sales and use tax by .25 cents and raised the income tax rate for high income earners (\$250,000 for individuals and \$500,000 for couples) to provide continuing funding for local school districts and community colleges.

Per Proposition 30, a community college district has the sole authority to determine how the moneys received from the Education Protection Account (EPA) are spent, provided that the governing board shall make these spending determinations in open session of a public meeting of the governing board and shall not use any of the funds from the EPA for administrative salaries and benefits or any other administrative costs. Furthermore, each entity receiving funds shall annually publish on its internet web site an accounting of how much money was received from the EPA and how that money was spent. Additionally, the annual independent financial and compliance audit required of community colleges shall ascertain and verify whether the funds provided from the EPA have been properly disbursed and expended as required by law. Expenses incurred to comply with these additional audit requirements may be paid from the EPA.

The District received the State Apportionment report that provided an estimate of \$24,638,464 that the District may receive from EPA funds.

Since the District now has the information needed to make a spending determination, the District is submitting this agenda item to comply with the Proposition 30 provision requiring the governing board to make the spending determination in an open session of a public meeting of the governing board. The estimated EPA funds that the District will receive are \$24,638,464 and the entire amount will be spent on instructional salaries. The EPA funds are NOT additional funds but rather are components of the "computational revenue" calculation.

The attached form identifying this \$24,638,464 as proceeds from the EPA and the District's intent to use these funds to partially fund instructional salaries, will be posted to the District's internet web site to meet the web site posting requirements. This same form will be updated at year-end with actual figures and will be audited as part of the District's annual financial and compliance audit. This agenda item was submitted by Rodrigo Garcia, District Director, Fiscal Affairs.

SUBJECT: Establishment of Citizens' Oversight Committee and Approval of Bylaws

BACKGROUND: The North Orange County Community College District (District) was successful at the election conducted on March 5, 2002 (the "2002 Election") in obtaining authorization from the District's voters to issue up to \$239,000,000 aggregate principal amount of the District's general obligation bonds ("Measure X"). A Bond Oversight Committee for Measure X has been established. The District was successful at the election conducted on November 4, 2014 (the "2014 Election") in obtaining authorization from the District's voters to issue up to \$574,000,000 aggregate principal amount of the District's school facilities bond ("Measure J"). The Elections were conducted under Proposition 39, being chaptered as the Strict Accountability in Local School Construction Bonds Act of 2000, at Section 15264 et seq. of the Education Code of the State ("Prop 39").

Pursuant to Section 15278 of the Education Code, the District is obligated to establish an Independent Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee for Measure J in order to satisfy the accountability requirements of Prop 39. The District wishes to dissolve the existing Measure X Committee and establish a new independent Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee and approve its Bylaws governing such committee in connection with both the issuance of bonds under Measure J and the expenditure of remaining bond proceeds generated under Measure X.

All appointments to the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee will be made by the Board from applications submitted to the District. The Committee shall consist of at least seven (7) members appointed by the Board from a list of candidates submitting written applications. Any interested person wishing to serve on this important committee should review the committee Bylaws for more information about the committee's role and responsibilities and complete the attached application. Current members of Measure X Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee are encouraged to apply to be considered for the Measure J Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee. Completed applications should be sent to the North Orange County Community College District by 4:30 PM on May 15, 2015, to the attention of the Chancellor. (The Bylaws which govern the Citizens' Oversight Committee are attached to the Application.)

NORTH ORANGE COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT APPLICATION FOR INDEPENDENT CITIZENS' OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE

The North Orange County Community College District is seeking qualified, interested individuals to serve on a committee of community leaders which will serve as the Independent Citizens' Oversight Committee for the implementation of both of the District's Measure X and Measure J college facilities bond program.

Proposition 39 Bond Election

On November 4, 2014, voters residing within the North Orange County Community College District passed Measure J. Measure J is a \$574,000,000 bond measure that authorizes funding for needed repairs, upgrades, and new construction projects to the District's schools. Proposition 39 required a 55% supermajority for approval; Measure J was passed by 55.02%.

Measure X was a \$239,000,000 bond approved by the voters on March 5, 2002.

Establishment of a Citizens' Oversight Committee

After a bond authorized under Proposition 39 is passed, State law requires that the North Orange County Community College District Board appoint an Independent Citizens' Oversight Committee to work with the District. Since the District previously had an oversight committee for Measure X, that committee is being reconstituted and the functions of that committee are being merged into the Independent Citizens' Oversight Committee, which will have oversight responsibility for both Measure X and Measure J.

Committee Responsibilities

In accordance with Education Code Section 15278(b), the Citizens' Oversight Committee shall:

- Inform the public concerning the District's expenditure of Measure X and Measure J bond proceeds;
- Review expenditure reports produced by the District to ensure that Measure X and Measure J bond proceeds were expended only for the purposes set forth in Measure X and Measure J, respectively; and
- Present to the Board in public session, an annual written report outlining their activities and conclusions regarding the expenditure of Measure X and Measure J bond proceeds.

The Bylaws which govern the Citizens' Oversight Committee are attached to this Application.

Appointment of Committee Members

All appointments will be made by the Board from applications submitted to the District. The Committee shall consist of at least seven (7) members appointed by the Board from a list of candidates submitting written applications, and based on criteria established by Prop 39, to wit:

- One (1) student enrolled and active in a community college support group, such as student government.
- One (1) member active in a business organization representing the business community located in the District.
- One (1) member active in a senior citizens' organization.

- One (1) member active in a bona-fide taxpayers association.
- One (1) member active in a support organization for the college, such as a foundation.
- Two (2) members of the community at-large.

Time Commitment and Term

Initial appointments will be staggered, such that some of the initial appointees will be appointed to serve one full two-year term. The other initial appointments will serve a one-year term, but will be eligible for reappointment by the Board for a second and third two-year term.

NORTH ORANGE COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT INDEPENDENT CITIZENS' BOND OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE BYLAWS

Section 1. Committee Established. The North Orange County Community College District (the "District") was successful at the election conducted on March 5, 2002 (the "2002 Election") in obtaining authorization from the District's voters to issue up to \$239,000,000 aggregate principal amount of the District's general obligation bonds ("Measure X"). A Bond Oversight Committee for Measure X has been established (the "Measure X Committee"). The District was successful at the election conducted on November 4, 2014 (the "2014 Election") in obtaining authorization from the District's voters to issue up to \$574,000,000 aggregate principal amount of the District's school facilities bond ("Measure J"). Measure X and Measure J are hereinafter referred to as the "Measures," and the 2002 Election and the 2014 Election are referred to as the "Elections". The Elections were conducted under Proposition 39, being chaptered as the Strict Accountability in Local School Construction Bonds Act of 2000, at Section 15264 et seg, of the Education Code of the State ("Prop 39"). Pursuant to Section 15278 of the Education Code, the District is obligated to establish an Independent Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee for Measure J in order to satisfy the accountability requirements of Prop 39. The District hereby confirms that the Independent Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee initially established for Measure X shall be reconstituted as a new Committee (the "Committee") which shall have the duties and rights set forth in these Bylaws with oversight responsibility for both Measure X and Measure J. The Committee does not have legal capacity independent from the District.

Section 2. Purposes. The purposes of the Committee are set forth in Prop 39, and these Bylaws are specifically made subject to the applicable provisions of Prop 39 as to the duties and rights of the Committee. The Committee shall be deemed to be subject to the Ralph M. Brown Public Meetings Act of the State of California and shall conduct its meetings in accordance with the provisions thereof. The District shall provide necessary administrative support to the Committee as shall be consistent with the Committee's purposes, as set forth in Prop 39.

The proceeds of general obligation bonds issued pursuant to the Elections are hereinafter referred to as "bond proceeds." The Committee shall confine itself specifically to bond proceeds generated under the Measures. Regular and deferred maintenance projects and all monies generated under other sources shall fall outside the scope of the Committee's review.

- **Section 3.** <u>Duties.</u> To carry out its stated purposes, the Committee shall perform only the duties set forth in Sections 3.1, 3.2, and 3.3 hereof, and shall refrain from those activities set forth in Sections 3.4 and 3.5.
- 3.1 <u>Inform the Public</u>. The Committee shall inform the public concerning the District's expenditure of bond proceeds. In fulfilling this duty, all official communications to either the Board or the public shall come from the Chair acting on behalf of the Committee. The Chair shall only release information that reflects the majority view of the Committee.

- 3.2 <u>Review Expenditures</u>. The Committee shall review expenditure reports produced by the District to ensure that (a) bond proceeds were expended only for the purposes set forth in Measure X and Measure J, respectively; and (b) no bond proceeds were used for teacher or administrative salaries or other operating expenses in compliance with Attorney General Opinion 04-110, issued on November 9, 2004.
- 3.3 <u>Annual Report</u>. The Committee shall present to the Board of Trustees of the District (the "Board") in public session, an annual written reports for each of the Measures which shall include the following:
 - (a) A statement indicating whether the District is in compliance with the requirements of Article XIIIA, Section 1(b)(3) of the California Constitution; and
 - (b) A summary of the Committee's proceedings and activities for the preceding year.
- 3.4 <u>Duties of the Board or Chancellor</u>. Either the Board or the Chancellor, as the Board shall determine, shall have the following powers reserved to it, and the Committee shall have no jurisdiction over the following types of activities:
 - (i) Review or approval of contracts;
 - (ii) Review or approval of change orders;
 - (iii) Expenditure of bond funds;
 - (iv) Handling of all legal matters;
 - (v) Approval of project plans and schedules;
 - (vi) Approval of all deferred maintenance plans; and
 - (vii) Approval of the sale of bonds.
- 3.5 <u>Measure X and Measure J Projects Only</u>. In recognition of the fact that the Committee is only charged with reviewing the prior expenditure of bond proceeds, the Board has not charged the Committee with responsibility for:
 - (a) Projects financed through the State of California, developer fees, redevelopment tax increment, certificates of participation, lease/revenue bonds, the general fund or the sale of surplus property without bond proceeds shall be outside the authority of the Committee.
 - (b) The establishment of priorities and order of construction for the bond projects, which shall be made by the Board in its sole discretion.
 - (c) The selection of architects, engineers, soils engineers, construction managers, project managers, CEQA consultants and such other professional

- service firms as are required to complete the project based on District criteria established by the Board in its sole discretion.
- (d) The approval of the design for each project including exterior materials, paint color, interior finishes, site plan and construction methods (modular vs. permanent) which shall be determined by the Board in its sole discretion.
- (e) The selection of independent audit firm(s), performance audit consultants and such other consultants as are necessary to support the activities of the Committee.
- (f) The approval of an annual budget for the Committee that is sufficient to carry out the activities set forth in Prop 39 and included herein.
- (g) The appointment or reappointment of qualified applicants to serve on the Committee, subject to legal limitations, and based on criteria adopted in the Board's sole discretion as part of carrying out its function under Prop 39.

Section 4. <u>Authorized Activities.</u>

- 4.1 In order to perform the duties set forth in Section 3, the Committee may engage in the following authorized activities:
 - (a) Receive copies of the District's annual, independent performance audit and annual, independent financial audit required by Prop 39 (Article XIIIA of the California Constitution) (together, the "Audits") at the same time said Audits are submitted to the District, and review the Audits, and no later than by March 31st of each year.
 - (b) Inspect District facilities and grounds for which bond proceeds have been or will be expended, in accordance with any access procedure established by the District's Chancellor.
 - (c) Review copies of deferred maintenance plans developed by the District.
 - (d) Review efforts by the District to maximize bond proceeds by implementing various cost-saving measures.
 - (e) Receive from the Board, within three months of the District receiving the Audits, responses to any and all findings, recommendations, and concerns addressed in the Audits, and review said responses.

Section 5. Membership.

5.1 Number.

The Committee shall consist of at least seven (7) members appointed by the Board from a list of candidates submitting written applications, and based on criteria established by Prop 39, to wit:

- One (1) student enrolled and active in a community college support group, such as student government.
- One (1) member active in a business organization representing the business community located in the District.
- One (1) member active in a senior citizens' organization.
- One (1) member active in a bona-fide taxpayers association.
- One (1) member active in a support organization for the college, such as a foundation.
- Two (2) members of the community at-large.

5.2 Qualification Standards.

- (a) To be a qualified person, he or she must be at least 18 years of age.
- (b) The Committee may not include any employee, official of the District or any vendor, contractor or consultant of the District.

5.3 Ethics: Conflicts of Interest.

- (a) Members of the Committee are not subject to the Political Reform Act (Gov. Code §§ 81000 et seq.), and are not required to complete Form 700; but each member shall comply with the Committee Ethics Policy attached as "Attachment A" to these Bylaws.
- (b) Pursuant to Section 35233 of the Education Code, the prohibitions contained in Article 4 (commencing with Section 1090) of Division 4 of Title 1 of the Government Code ("Article 4") and Article 4.7 (commencing with Section 1125) of Division 4 of Title 1 of the Government Code ("Article 4.7") are applicable to members of the Committee. Accordingly:
 - (i) Members of the Committee shall not be financially interested in any contract made by them in their official capacities or by the Committee, nor shall they be purchasers at any sale or vendors at any purchase made by them in their official capacity, all as prohibited by Article 4; and
 - (ii) Members of the Committee shall not engage in any employment, activity, or enterprise for compensation which is inconsistent, incompatible, in conflict with, or inimical to duties as a member of the Committee or with the duties, functions, or responsibilities of the Committee or the District. A member of the Committee shall not perform any work, service, or counsel for compensation where any part of his or her efforts will be subject to approval by any other officer, employee, board, or commission of the District's Board, except as permitted under Article 4.7.

- 5.4 <u>Term.</u> Except as otherwise provided herein, each member shall serve a term of two (2) years, commencing as of the date of appointment by the Board. No member may serve more than three (3) consecutive terms. At the Committee's first meeting, members will draw lots or otherwise select a minimum of two members to serve for an initial one (1) year term and the remaining members for an initial two (2) year term. Members whose terms have expired may continue to serve on the Committee until a successor has been appointed. Members of the Measure X Committee may be appointed to the Committee and be entitled to new terms as described herein, regardless of their period of service on the Measure X Committee.
- 5.5 <u>Appointment</u>. Members of the Committee shall be appointed by the Board through the following process: (a) the District may advertise in the local newspapers, on its website, and in other customary forums, as well as solicit appropriate local groups for applications; (b) the Chancellor will review the applications; and (c) the Chancellor will make recommendations to the Board.
- 5.6 Removal; Vacancy. The Board may remove any Committee member for any reason, including failure to attend two consecutive Committee meetings without reasonable excuse or for failure to comply with the Committee Ethics Policy. Upon a member's removal, his or her seat shall be declared vacant. The Board, in accordance with the established appointment process shall fill any vacancies on the Committee. The Board shall seek to fill vacancies within 90 days of the date of occurrence of a vacancy.
- 5.7 <u>Compensation</u>. The Committee members shall not be compensated for their services.
- 5.8 <u>Authority of Members</u>. (a) Committee members shall not have the authority to direct staff of the District; (b) individual members of the Committee retain the right to address the Board, either on behalf of the Committee or as an individual; (c) the Committee shall not establish sub-committees for any purpose; and (d) the Committee shall have the right to request and receive copies of any public records relating to projects funded by the Measures.

Section 6. Meetings of the Committee.

- 6.1 <u>Regular Meetings</u>. The Committee shall meet at least once a year, but shall not meet more frequently than quarterly.
- 6.2 <u>Location</u>. All meetings shall be held within the boundaries of the North Orange County Community College District.
- 6.3 <u>Procedures</u>. All meetings shall be open to the public in accordance with the Ralph M. Brown Act, Government Code Section 54950 et seq. Meetings shall be conducted according to such additional procedural rules as the Committee may adopt. A majority of the number of Committee members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business of the Committee.

Section 7. <u>District Support</u>.

- 7.1 The District shall provide to the Committee necessary technical and administrative assistance as follows:
 - (a) preparation of and posting of public notices as required by the Brown Act, ensuring that all notices to the public are provided in the same manner as notices regarding meetings of the District Board;
 - (b) provision of a meeting room, including any necessary audio/visual equipment;
 - (c) preparation, translation and copies of any documentary meeting materials, such as agendas and reports; and
 - (d) retention of all Committee records, and providing public access to such records on an Internet website maintained by the District.
- 7.2 District staff and/or District consultants shall attend Committee proceedings in order to report on the status of projects and the expenditure of bond proceeds.
- **Section 8.** Reports. In addition to the Annual Report required in Section 3.3, the Committee may report to the Board from time to time in order to advise the Board on the activities of the Committee. Such report shall be in writing and shall summarize the proceedings and activities conducted by the Committee.
- **Section 9.** Officers. The Chancellor shall appoint the initial Chair. Thereafter, the Committee shall elect a Chair and a Vice-Chair who shall act as Chair only when the Chair is absent. The Chair and Vice-Chair shall serve in such capacities for a term of one year and may be re-elected by vote of a majority of the members of the Committee.
- **Section 10. <u>Amendment of Bylaws</u>**. Any amendment to these Bylaws shall be approved by a majority vote of the Board.
- **Section 11. Termination**. The Committee shall automatically terminate and disband concurrently with the Committee's submission of the final respective Annual Report which reflects the final accounting of the expenditure of all Measure X and Measure J monies.

CITIZENS' BOND OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE ETHICS POLICY STATEMENT

This Ethics Policy Statement provides general guidelines for Committee members in carrying out their responsibilities. Not all ethical issues that Committee members face are covered in this Statement. However, this Statement captures some of the critical areas that help define ethical and professional conduct for Committee members. The provisions of this Statement were developed from existing laws, rules, policies and procedures as well as from concepts that define generally accepted good business practices. Committee members are expected to strictly adhere to the provisions of this Ethics Policy.

POLICY

- CONFLICT OF INTEREST. A Committee member shall not make or influence a District decision related to: (1) any contract funded by bond proceeds, or (2) any construction project which will benefit the Committee member's outside employment, business, or a personal finance or benefit an immediate family member, such as a spouse, child or parent.
- OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT. A Committee member shall not use his or her authority over a particular matter to negotiate future employment with any person or organization that relates to: (1) any contract funded by bond proceeds, or (2) any construction project. A Committee member shall not make or influence a District decision related to any construction project involving the interest of a person with whom the member has an agreement concerning current or future employment, or remuneration of any kind. For a period of two (2) years after leaving the Committee, a former Committee member may not represent any person or organization for compensation in connection with any matter pending before the District that, as a Committee member, he or she participated in personally and substantially. Specifically, for a period of two (2) years after leaving the Committee, a former Committee member and the companies and businesses for which the member works shall be prohibited from contracting with the District with respect to: (1) bidding on projects funded by the bond proceeds; and (2) any construction project.
- COMMITMENT TO UPHOLD LAW. A Committee member shall uphold the federal and California Constitutions, the laws and regulations of the United States and the State of California (particularly the Education Code) and all other applicable government entities, and the policies, procedures, rules and regulations of North Orange County Community College District.
- COMMITMENT TO DISTRICT. A Committee member shall place the interests of the District above any personal or business interest of the member.

BACKGROUND: Revised 2014-2015 fiscal year allocations have been distributed for various federal-, state-, and locally-funded programs. Based on these revised allocation amounts, adjustments are needed to various General Fund and Child Development Fund revenue and expenditure budgets that were previously approved in the District Proposed Budget on September 9, 2014.

The General Fund programs requiring an adjustment are Adult Ed & Family Literacy Act Grant (AEFLA), Amaturo Group Grant, Basic Skills, Board Financial Assistance Program (BFAP), California Work Opportunities and Responsibilities to Kids (CalWORKs), Cooperative Agencies Resources for Education (CARE), Disabled Student Programs and Services (DSPS), English Literacy and Civics Grant (EL Civics), Extended Opportunities Programs and Services (EOPS), Student Success & Support Program (SSSP), and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF).

The Child Development Fund program requiring an adjustment is FC General Child Care Program.

This agenda item was submitted by Kashu Vyas, District Manager, Fiscal Affairs.

How does this relate to the five District Strategic Directions? This item responds to Direction #4: The District will implement best practices related to planning including: transparent decision-making processes, support of strategic and comprehensive planning activities at campus and District levels, and the allocation of resources to fund planning priorities; and Direction #5: The District will develop and sustain collaborative projects and partnerships with the community's educational institutions, civic organizations, and businesses.

How does this relate to Board Policy: This agenda item is submitted in accordance with Board Policy 6250, Budget Management.

FUNDING SOURCE AND FINANCIAL IMPACT: Various programs have received revised 2014-2015 allocations since the adoption of the District Proposed Budget on September 9, 2014. Budget adjustments are being submitted to revise revenue and expenditure budgets accordingly for the 2014-2015 fiscal year.

SUBJECT: Revised Board Policies

BACKGROUND: Twice a year, the Community College League of California provides updates to Board Policies and Administrative Procedures. The District Consultation Council reached consensus on the following revised Board Policies on February 23, 2015. The proposed, revised policies were first presented to the Board at its March 24, 2015, meeting and are now presented for action.

Chapter 1, The District, BP1001, Mission, Vision, & Values Statements: This was revised after gathering District-wide input via email, open forums, and a google forum. In addition, it was revised by Chancellor's Staff and taken back to the campuses for final revisions. The word "a" has been inserted in the second sentence of section 3.1 between "in" and "global" per the Board's recommendation at its March 24, 2015, meeting.

Also, the following revisions were subsequently proposed by a Member of the Board of Trustees and are indicated with a double-line on pages 7.b.4 and 7.b.5:

<u>Mission Statement</u>: The District exists to serve students who come to the District as diverse learners. Thus, the following mission statement is proposed:

The mission of the North Orange County Community College District is to serve and enrich our diverse communities by providing a comprehensive program of educational opportunities that are accessible, relevant and academically excellent. We are unequivocally committed to student success and lifelong learning.

<u>Vision Statement</u>: This talks about what the District's students will become as a result of their experience within the District. Thus, the following Vision Statement is proposed:

Our diverse learners will be prepared to shape their future and become engaged citizens in our democracy.

Values – Shared Beliefs:

- 3.3 <u>Commitment</u> (If the mission statement as proposed above is agreed upon, then 3.3 is unnecessary and the balance of the statements will be renumbered.)
- 3.6 <u>Stewardship</u>: Delete the second sentence since 3.7 captures the same value and is not repetitive. Thus, it would read as follows:

We uphold the responsibility for public trust of our mission and resources.

3.7 <u>Respect</u>: We cultivate an atmosphere of courtesy, civility and <u>transparency</u> with all students and employees in the District by promoting a willingness to collaborate and a responsibility for all to be engaged as collegial partners in carrying out the District's mission.

Chapter 2, Board of Trustees, BP2410, Policy and Administrative Procedures: Title change to "Policies and Administrative Procedures," additional language requiring the Board to regularly assess its policies for effectiveness in fulfilling the District's mission was added; and Accreditation Standards were updated.

Chapter 2, Board of Trustees, BP2435, Evaluation of Chancellor: The word "the" was inserted in the title to align it with the title of AP2435, and the Accreditation Standards were updated.

Revised BP/AP3410, Nondiscrimination (Changed to Unlawful Discrimination) Revised BP3430, Unlawful Discrimination (Changed to Prohibition of Harassment) Deletion of Old AP3430, Unlawful Discrimination

These policies and administrative procedures were revised to be in compliance with Title 5 Regulations, the Education Code, the Government Code, Federal regulations, Office of Civil Rights (OCR) guidance, and a guidance letter from the State Chancellor's Office. In addition to the legal requirements, and assistance from legal counsel, changes were made to clarify language to ensure that the process on how to file a complaint is clearly defined and more closely aligned to Title 5 Regulations.

<u>BP3410</u>, <u>Nondiscrimination</u> renamed <u>Unlawful Discrimination</u>: The "Reference" section was updated; new section 1.0 was inserted from old AP3410, Nondiscrimination; old section 2.0 was deleted and old section 1.0 became new section 2.0; new sections 3.0 and 4.0 were added; sections 5.0, 6.0 and 7.0 were renumbered; and finally, the last paragraph on page one identifies the contact person and section 6.0 includes the addition of military and veteran status".

BP3430, Unlawful Discrimination, renamed Prohibition of Harassment: The "Reference" section was updated; section 1.0 was revised; section 2.0 and its subsections were replaced with new section 2.0 and subsection 2.1 was added to identify the contact person; new section 3.0 and the subsections were deleted; new section 4.0 and subsections; and old subsections 4.0, 5.0, 6.0, 7.0, and 8.0 were deleted. The District Consultation Council has approved revised Administrative Procedure 3410, Unlawful Discrimination, and agreed on the deletion of old Administrative Procedure 3430, Unlawful Discrimination. Board Policies 3410 and 3430 will both refer readers to Administrative Procedure 3410, Unlawful Discrimination, for filing complaints.

Chapter 4, Academic Affairs, BP4040, Library Services: Title change to "Library and Learning Support Services," to align with terminology used in accreditation standards; section 1.0 was revised; and the Accreditation Standard was added to the "Reference" section.

Chapter 5, Student Services, BP5550, Speech: Time, Place, and Manner: CCLC recommends placing this policy and correlating administrative procedure in Chapter 3, General Institution, as BP3900 since this applies to everyone, not just students. There are no other revisions.

Chapter 5, Student Services, BP5700, Athletics: The name of "Sports Guides" was changed to "Sport Championship Handbooks" in section 3.0

Chapter 6, Business & Fiscal Affairs, BP6700, Civic Center and Other Facilities Use: This was revised to add military and veteran status as a protected status in section 2.0, along with additional verbiage, and the Ed. Codes were updated.

How does this relate to the five District-wide Strategic Directions? This item responds to District Strategic IV: The District will implement best practices related to planning including; transparent decision-making processes, support of strategic and comprehensive planning activities at campus and district levels, and the allocation of resources to fund planning priorities.

How does this relate to Board Policy? This item is in accordance with Board Policy 2410, Policy and Administrative Procedures.

- 1.0 The Board may adopt such policies as are authorized by law or determined by the Board to be necessary for the efficient operation of the District. Board policies are intended to be statements of intent by the Board on a specific issue within its subject matter jurisdiction.

Proposed changes or additions shall be introduced not less than one regular meeting prior to the meeting at which action is recommended. - 4.0 Administrative procedures are to be issued by the Chancellor as statements of method to be used in implementing Board Policy. Such administrative procedures shall be consistent with the intent of Board Policy. Administrative procedures may be revised as deemed necessary by the Chancellor.
- 5.0 The Chancellor shall, annually, provide each member of the Board with any revisions to administrative procedures since the last time they were provided. The Board reserves the right to direct revisions of the administrative procedures should they, in the Board=s judgment, be inconsistent with the Board=s own policies.

Copies of all policies and administrative procedures shall be readily available to District employees through the District's website and the Chancellor=s Office.

- 1.0 The policy of the North Orange County Community College District is to provide an educational, employment, and business environment including but not limited to access to its services, classes, and programs in which no person shall be subjected to unlawful harassment and where such environment is free from unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, sexual favoritism, or other verbal or physical conduct or communications constituting sexual harassment. It shall also be free of other unlawful harassment, including but not limited to harassment that is based on: race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, marital status, sex, age, or sexual orientation, military and veteran status of any person, or because he or she is perceived to have one or more of the foregoing characteristics.
- 2.0 Students and employees who believe they have been harassed or retaliated against in violation of this policy should immediately report such incidents by following the procedures described in Administrative Procedure 3410, Unlawful Discrimination.
 - 2.1 The following person is designated by the North Orange County Community College District as the Responsible Officer for receiving and coordinating the investigation of all unlawful discrimination complaints, including sexual harassment:

The Chancellor shall further establish procedures for employees, students, and other members of the campus community that provide for the investigation and resolution of complaints regarding harassment and discrimination, and procedures for students to resolve complaints of harassment and discrimination. All participants are protected from retaliatory acts by the District, its employees, students, and agents.

BP 3900 Speech: Time, Place, and Manner

Reference:

Education Code Sections 66301, 76120 Penal Code Section 422.6

- The North Orange County Community College District ("the District") is committed to assuring that all persons may exercise their constitutional rights protected under the First Amendment to the United States Constitution and article I, section 2, of the California Constitution. The District's commitment to the exercise of free speech and free expression is not intended to convert all of the facilities maintained and/or owned by the District into public forums, limited public or designated public forums. As any owner of property, the District reserves the right to limit the use of its facilities for the exercise of free speech and free expression consistent with the United States Constitution and the California Constitution. The District's commitment to the exercise of free speech and free expression set forth herein is not intended to permit expression and activity utilizing District facilities which is not otherwise protected by the First Amendment or article I, section 2, of the California Constitution (e.g., obscenity, illegal activity, advertising of illegal substances, defamatory speech, and speech and activity that causes substantial disruption of the orderly operation of the District's campuses).
- 2.0 The District desires to provide the best available curriculum and facilities in order to encourage its students to matriculate, study, graduate, obtain a place of employment, or go on to obtain a further degree. This policy is designed to encourage students who want to attend class and study in a peaceful and quiet setting to do so without substantial disruption. Maintenance of an atmosphere conducive to learning on campus in order to further the educational process is essential to the District, its students, faculty, and staff.
- 3.0 This policy is intended to further the District's substantial interests in 1) protecting student health and safety; 2) preventing substantial disruption of the learning environment and the orderly operation of District campuses; 3) preserving District facilities for their intended use; 4) coordinating multiple uses of limited space; 5) preventing unlawful, dangerous, or impermissible uses of District facilities; and 6) assuring financial accountability for damages and litter caused by the use of District facilities for speech and advocacy purposes.
- 4.0 It is the policy of the District that its interpretation of California Education Code section 76120, be consistent with the First Amendment of the United States Constitution, article I, section 2 of the California Constitution and California Education Code section 66301, and that none of the District's regulations shall prohibit any speech or expression unless it falls outside the protection of the First Amendment to the United States Constitution an article I, section 2 of the California Constitution.
- 5.0 The campuses of the District are non-public forums, except for those areas that are designated free speech assembly area(s), which are limited public forums. Each college shall designate at least one area where peaceful assembly may take place for the purpose of free expression, exchange of ideas, and advocacy by the students and staff of the college. Such an exchange is best achieved in an atmosphere of mutual respect on the part of the speaker and the audience, recognizing the right of the speaker to be heard and the right of the

audience to listen. The Chancellor or designee shall enact such administrative procedures as are necessary to reasonably regulate the time, place, and manner of the exercise of free expression in the designated free speech assembly area(s).

- 6.0 The administrative procedures promulgated by the Chancellor or designee shall not prohibit the right of students to exercise free expression, including but not limited to the use of bulletin boards designated for such use, the distribution of printed materials or petitions, and the wearing of buttons, badges, or other insignia.
- 7.0 Students shall be free to exercise their rights of free expression, subject to the requirements of this policy.
- 8.0 Speech shall be prohibited that is defamatory, obscene according to current legal standards, or which so incites others as to create a clear and present danger of the commission of unlawful acts on District property or the violation of District policies or procedures, or the substantial disruption of the orderly operation of the District.
- 9.0 Nothing in this policy shall prohibit the regulation of hate violence, so long as the regulation conforms to the requirements of the First Amendment to the United States Constitution, and of article 2, section 2 of the California Constitution. Students may be disciplined for harassment, threats, or intimidation unless such speech is legally protected.

BP 4040 Library and Learning Support Services

Reference:

Education Code Section 78100; Civil Code Section 1798.90; WASC/ACCJC Accreditation Standard II

- 1.0 The District shall have library and learning support services that are an integral part of the institutions' educational programs and will comply with the requirements of the Reader Privacy Act.
- 2.0 The purpose of the college library is to actively and effectively support instruction by serving as a resource for teaching and learning. The library shall provide access to information both within and beyond the library walls. The library shall provide information resources that promote a better understanding and appreciation of the cultural, practical and aesthetic elements of the world around us. Although the general community has access to the college libraries, these libraries are for the specific support of college educational programs, students, and staff.
- 3.0 Four important functions of the libraries are to:
 - 3.1 Maintain a relevant, multi-cultural collection, which provides materials to challenge each student according to his/her abilities.
 - 3.2 Provide an environment for students and faculty that promotes the development of information competency.
 - 3.3 Provide a professional and paraprofessional staff to assist and instruct in the use of information resources.
 - 3.4 Provide leadership in assisting faculty members to promote the use of library resources in instruction and curriculum, and in the development of critical thinking by their students.

BP 5700 Athletics

Reference:

Title IX, Education Amendments of 1972; Education Code Section 66271.6, 66271.8, 67360, et seq., 78223

- 1.0 The District is committed to the value of gender equity for both men and women in intercollegiate athletics and shall act affirmatively to assure gender equity in the quality and quantity of participation in athletics.
- 2.0 The District may maintain an organized program for men and women in intercollegiate athletics. The program shall not discriminate on the basis of gender in the availability of athletic opportunities.
- 3.0 The Chancellor or designee shall assure that the athletics program complies with the California Community College Athletic Association (CCCAA) and Sport Championship Handbooks, and appropriate Conference Constitution regarding student athlete participation.

BP 6700 Civic Center and Other Facilities Use

Reference:

Education Code Sections 82537 and 82542

- 1.0 The Vice Chancellor, Finance & Facilities shall establish procedures regarding the use of college property, including but not limited to facilities, equipment and supplies, by community groups and other outside contractors.
 - These administrative procedures shall reflect the requirements of applicable law, including Education Code Section 82537, regarding Civic Centers. The regulations shall include reasonable rules regarding the time, place and manner of use of District facilities. They shall assure that persons or organizations using college property are charged such fees as are authorized by law. Public use of District property shall not interfere with scheduled instructional programs or other activities.
- 2.0 No group or organization may use District property for purposes that discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, military or veteran status, disability, gender, gender identity, gender expression, or sexual orientation, or the perception that a person has one or more of the foregoing characteristics, or because a person associates with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics, or on any basis prohibited by law.
- 3.0 The District will provide free usage in accordance with Education Code Section 82542(a).
- 4.0 All District property will be subject to a facility use charge in accordance with Education Code Section 82545(b-f).

BP 2015 Student Members

Reference:

Education Code Section 72023.5

- 1.0 The Board shall include two student members to represent the students at large. The term of office shall be one year, commencing June 1. Student members are authorized to cast advisory votes only, which shall not be included in determining the vote required to carry any measure before the Board, but shall be recorded in the official minutes of the Board meeting. Advisory votes may not be cast on motions related to personnel and labor relations. Student members are expected to gather input and opinions from the students at large, as well as the Associated Students, on any relevant agenda items and provide such input to the Board of Trustees.
- 2.0 To be eligible for election as a student trustee, students must be residents of California at the time of nomination and during the term of service; must have completed 12 units at the college they seek to represent; shall be enrolled in and must maintain enrollment in a minimum of five (5) units at the college they represent at the time of nomination and throughout the term of service, and must maintain a minimum of a cumulative 2.0 grade point average. If, on the first day of each semester, or during the term of service, a student member fails to meet the criteria of this policy, the student member shall be disqualified for service on the Board. The student member is not required to give up employment with the District.
 - 2.1 These requirements apply to the spring and fall semesters only.
- 3.0 Student members shall be seated with the Board and shall be recognized as full members of the Board at meetings. Student members may not attend closed session. Student members are entitled to participate in discussion of issues and receive all materials presented to members of the Board (except for closed session). Student members shall be entitled to any mileage allowance necessary to attend board meetings to the same extent as publicly elected trustees.
 - 3.1 Student members may make or second open session motions, except motions underlying personnel and labor relations. Student members are encouraged to participate in the discussion of issues and agenda items in open session.
- 4.0 Student members who attend all Board meetings that they are legally allowed to attend shall receive 50 percent of the compensation afforded to other individual members of the Board of Trustees, pursuant to Education Code Section 72425. Any Board meetings missed by a student member shall result in a pro rata reduction in compensation for that month, except under the following condition: A student member may be paid for the first two meetings from which he/she is absent in a calendar year if the Board, by resolution adopted and included in its minutes, finds at the time of the meeting that the student member was ill, on jury duty, performing services outside the meeting for the District, or the absence is due to a hardship deemed acceptable by the Board.

- 5.0 The Board encourages participation of its student members in trustee-related conferences and activities and may approve reasonable expenses that fall within the guidelines of Board policies.
- On or before May 15 of each year, the Board shall consider whether to afford the student member any of the privileges noted in this policy by reviewing it for readoption.
