BACKGROUND: On June 28, 2011, the Board formally approved the adoption of the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) issued Statement Number 54, Fund Balance and Governmental Fund Type Definitions, to change how fund balance information is reported and improve the usefulness of fund balance reporting. GASB 54 established new fund balance classifications as an attempt to make fund balance classifications easier to understand and apply. Since the District reports its financial statements following the Business Type Activity (BTA) model of GASB Statements No. 34 and 35, in accordance with the recommendation of the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office, it does not technically need to comply with GASB Statement No. 54. However, the District chose to include "fund" financial statements as supplementary information in its annual audited financial report to provide a more useful presentation of the financial status of the various district funds. One of these classifications is the "Committed" Fund Balance which includes amounts that can only be used for specific purposes under a formal action of the Board. Since its adoption the Board has not taken a formal action to commit any funds.

The State has begun to recognize the significant financial impact of the current and future STRS and PERS increases on community colleges by allocating a base augmentation to the district's apportionment funding beginning in the 2015-16 State Budget. North Orange County Community College District received an estimated base allocation increase of \$8,345,728, in which \$2,008,000 have been allocated for 2015-16 STRS and PERS increases. The remaining estimated augmentation of \$6,337,728, was earmarked for future STRS and PERS increases in the District's 2015-16 Proposed Budget adopted by the Board on September 8, 2015. Therefore, formal action by the Board is needed to commit this estimated remaining augmentation for future STRS and PERS increases. BACKGROUND: District is preparing for the purchase, delivery and installation of desktop computer equipment for Fullerton College and School of Continuing of Education. FC & SCE are replacing the Hewlett-Packard desktop computer systems in various areas throughout the campus and the computer labs. Those desktop computer systems have exceeded their warranties and need to be upgraded in accordance with the District's 3-year life cycle plan. To make the purchase of the required computer equipment, the piggyback contracting method has been selected. Public Contract Code Section 20652 authorizes the use of this method when it is in the best interest of the District.

The Western States Contracting Alliance (WSCA) has formed a cooperative purchasing organization, the National Association of State Procurement Officials (NASPO), to manage a cooperative purchasing program approved by the California's State Chief Procurement Official and make contracts available to authorized governmental entities such as public schools and institutions of higher education. The WSCA-NASPO contract planned for this use is the computer contract (7-15-70-34-001) with Hewlett Packard. This piggyback contract utilizes a previously conducted bidding process and contract award to WSCA members.

BACKGROUND: In November of 2014, the District received approval in a bond election awarding \$574 million dollars in funding for the construction the modernization, upgrade and new construction of facilities at the District's multiple sites. As an initial step in the realization of District projects, the District undertook steps to solicit, review and recommend a list of Architect/Engineers (AE's) from which the District could invite firms to provide further qualifications for selection to execute services for specific projects. On December 9, 2014, the Board approved the list of qualified firms. Included in the bond language, and in the Districts Facilities Master Plan, is provision for the construction of a new Science, Engineering, and Mathematics (SEM) Building at Cypress College.

Since the SEM Project is of vital importance to the District and to the College to accommodate a long waiting list of potential students, it was identified as a very high priority project. Upon further clarification and validation of the proposed schedule and budget for the SEM Project, the District proceeded to evaluate all of the AE firms, from the previously Board approved list, to ascertain their qualifications based on science building experience to execute the project. As a result, the staff began a competitive process to obtain the architectural and engineering services in accordance with the established protocol of the District. The following steps were taken:

- 1. An evaluation matrix, scoring each firm for experience with projects similar to the SEM Project, was prepared.
- 2. References for each firm with the best qualifying experience were phoned and reference responses were recorded.
- 3. The evaluation matrix and reference records were distributed to the District Selection Committee members for their information.
- 4. A District Selection Committee was identified and composed of administrators, faculty, Dean, and District Program Manager who was a non-voting observer.
- 5. The top six (6) scoring firms were invited to interview and interviews were held on March 21, 2016 and March 22, 2016.
- 6. The District Selection Committee met on March 22, 2016 to review and rank the responses.
- 7. The District Selection Committee unanimously voted to select the Architect based on their leading score in the evaluation process.

It was the consensus of the Committee that the firm of LPA, Incorporated be recommended as the Architect of Record for the Cypress College SEM Building Project. LPA, Incorporated will begin program validation for the SEM Building in order to better define total project costs. It is estimated that program validation is 10% of the overall architect fee, but contracting for the first phase of the project allows for additional information to be gathered. The areas related to project delivery method and the Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certification still need to be evaluated. Both of those areas will influence the overall project cost, including the architect fees. Staff expects to have the details of the architecture agreement finalized in the next several months and will bring forward a revised agenda item at that time.

The term of the agreement shall be effective May 11, 2016, and terminate on June 30, 2021. Authorization is further requested for the Interim Vice-Chancellor, Finance & Facilities, to execute the agreement on behalf of the District.

BACKGROUND: An election was held in the North Orange County Community College District on November 4, 2014 for the issuance and sale of general obligation bonds of the District for various purposes in the maximum amount of \$574,000,000 (the "Measure J"). The District now desires to issue its first series of bonds under Measure J in an amount not-to-exceed \$100,000,000 (the "Bonds"). The Bonds are being authorized for sale for the purpose of providing funds to finance projects approved by Measure J and to pay the costs of issuing the Bonds.

- (a) <u>Bond Resolution</u>. This Resolution authorizes the issuance of Bonds, specifies the basic terms, parameters and forms of the Bonds, and approves the form of Purchase Contract and form of Preliminary Official Statement described below. In particular, Section 1 of the Resolution establishes the maximum aggregate initial principal amount of the Bonds to be issued (\$100,000,000). Section 4 of the Resolution states the maximum underwriters' discount (0.255%) with respect to the Bonds, the maximum legal interest rate on the Bonds, and authorizes the Bonds to be sold at a negotiated sale to Morgan Stanley & Co. LLC, as representative on behalf of itself and Piper Jaffray & Co., as the underwriters (the "Underwriters"). The Resolution authorizes the issuance of current interest bonds only; capital appreciation bonds are not authorized.
- (b) <u>Form of Purchase Contract</u>. The Resolution approves the form of the Purchase Contract. Pursuant to the Purchase Contract, the Underwriters will agree to buy the Bonds from the District. All the conditions of closing the transaction are set forth in this document, including the documentation to be provided at the closing by various parties. Upon the pricing of the Bonds, the final execution copy of the Purchase Contract will be prepared following this form.
- (c) <u>Form of Preliminary Official Statement</u>. The Resolution approves the form of the Preliminary Official Statement. The Preliminary Official Statement (the "POS") is the offering document describing the Bonds which may be distributed to prospective purchasers of the Bonds. The POS discloses information with respect to, among other things, (i) the proposed uses of proceeds of the Bonds, (ii) the terms of the Bonds (interest rate, redemption terms,

- etc.), (iii) the bond insurance policy for the Bonds, if any, (iv) the security for repayment of the Bonds (the *ad valorem* property tax levy), (v) information with respect to the District's tax base (upon which such *ad valorem* property taxes may be levied), (vi) District financial and operating data, (vii) continuing disclosure with respect to the Bonds and the District, and (viii) absence of material litigation and other miscellaneous matters expected to be of interest to prospective purchasers of the Bonds. Following the pricing of the Bonds, a final Official Statement for the Bonds will be prepared, substantially in the form of the POS.
- (d) Form of the Continuing Disclosure Certificate. The form of the Continuing Disclosure Certificate can be found in APPENDIX C to the POS. Effective July 3, 1995, all underwriters of municipal bonds are obligated to procure from any public agency issuing debt a covenant that such public agency will annually file "material financial information and operating data" with respect to such public agency through the web-based Electronic Municipal Market Access ("EMMA") system maintained by the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (a federal agency that regulates "broker-dealers," including investment bank firms that underwrite municipal obligations). This requirement is expected to be satisfied by the filing of the District's audited financial statements and other operating information about the District, in the same manner the District has filed such information in connection with prior bond issuances. The purpose of the law is to provide investors in the Bonds with current information regarding the District. Similar laws have governed the corporate debt market for many years.

BACKGROUND: On June 1, 2011 the Board of Trustees authorized the Vice Chancellor, Finance and Facilities to execute a contract for vending machine services for the Anaheim Campus and Cypress College for a five-year period. The contract was awarded to First Class Vending who offered the highest commission rate to the two sites as follows:

First Class Vending, 40% Commission Rate, Anaheim Campus Snacks and beverage vending plus a one-time bonus of \$15,000 and an annual scholarship in the amount of \$500 per year.

First Class Vending, 42% Commission Rate, Cypress College Snacks and beverage vending plus one-time bonus of \$15,000 and an annual scholarship in the amount of \$500 per year.

These commission rates are considered to be highly competitive and are the highest rates ever offered by a vending operator at either site. In addition, the service of First Class Vending over the five-year period of the existing contract has been exemplary with virtually no intervention from the District to maintain the service level. Both Anaheim Campus and Cypress College recommend renewal of the contract with First Class Vending for an additional five years with the same terms including a 90-day termination class without penalty with prior written notice. The renewed contract will begin July 1, 2016, and end June 30, 2021. This agenda item was submitted by Karen Cant, Vice President Administrative Services, Cypress College.

BACKGROUND: The Fullerton College curriculum has been updated to include a cyber-security program. This is in response to increased need for cyber-security professionals in the workforce and requests from the appropriate advisory committees. To support this program, it is necessary to provide a safe and secure training environment that allows the students to learn the necessary skills and abilities. To make the purchase of the necessary hardware, system software, installation and maintenance to operate the cyber security program appropriately, the piggyback contracting method has been selected. Public Contract Code Section 20652 authorizes the use of this method when it is in the best interest of the District.

The Western States Contracting Alliance (WSCA) has formed a cooperative purchasing organization, the National Association of State Procurement Officials (NASPO), to manage a cooperative purchasing program approved by the California's State Chief Procurement Official and make contracts available to authorized governmental entities such as public schools and institutions of higher education. The WSCA-NASPO contract planned for this use is the computer contract (7-15-70-34-002) with Hewlett Packard. This piggyback contract utilizes a previously conducted bidding process and contract award to WSCA members.

The cost of the hardware, software, installation and maintenance for Fullerton College cyber security program is \$220,763.76. This agenda item was submitted by Jenney Ho, District Director, Purchasing, Deborah Ludford, District Director, Information Services, and Dale Craig, Professor, CIS, at Fullerton College.

Graduation Requirements for a Baccalaureate Degree (Revised and approved by the Cypress Academic Senate, 3/10/16)

Graduation requirements for the Baccalaureate Degree are prescribed by the California Community Colleges Board of Governors, Title 5, and the North Orange County Community College District Board of Trustees. Specifications are based upon recommendations by the Academic Senate of California Community Colleges. A Baccalaureate Degree may be earned upon satisfactory completion of all of the following:

1. Total Unit Degree Requirement

Any Cypress College Baccalaureate Degree will contain a minimum of 120 units.

2. Residence Requirement

At least 24 units of upper division coursework should be completed at Cypress College.

3. Cultural Diversity Requirement

Students must take a minimum of one (3 unit) course approved by Cypress College as a Cultural Diversity course. This course may be double-counted for major or general education degree requirements.

4. General Education Requirements

All students are required to complete general education. Students may choose to complete:

a. CSU General Education Breadth pattern of 39 units;

b. IGETC (Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum) of 37 units.

and

c. A minimum of 6 upper division General Education Coursework.

5. Major Requirement

- a. All students must take required major courses as specified by the major department and earn a grade of "C" or better in each course.
- **b.** Students should review specific major admissions requirements and prerequisites in the program descriptions area of the catalog for more detail.

6. Scholarship Requirement

A cumulative grade-point average (GPA) of 2.0 in all course work attempted and a 2.0 "C" in all courses taken within the discipline.

7. Elective Courses

A student may complete additional degree-applicable classes to meet the minimum degree requirement of 120 units if needed and depending on specific major requirements.

NOTE: If applicable, students should contact a major counselor to discuss using coursework from other regionally accredited colleges and universities, Advanced Placement (AP) exam credit, College Level Exam Program (CLEP) exam credit, or International Baccalaureate (IB) exam credit towards degree requirements.

Upper division courses are defined as requiring lower division knowledge and applying that knowledge as demonstrated measures of critical thinking through writing, oral communication, or computation. Upper division coursework may also encompass research elements, workforce training, apprenticeships, internships, required practicum, or capstone projects. Upper division courses typically will have one or more lower division or upper division prerequisites that have been established using content review of the entry skills necessary to be successful as outlined in the California Code of Regulations (CCR), title 5, section 55003. Courses that have been designated as upper division are only intended to be applicable to baccalaureate degrees.

Upper Division Unit and General Education Requirements

Each baccalaureate degree must require a minimum of 24 semester units of upper division coursework including a minimum of six semester units of upper division general education courses. Upper division general education courses should come from at least two disciplines outside of the major, one of which must have an emphasis in written communication, oral communication, or computation. These upper division general education courses may be developed in any discipline, but the courses should relate to the required course work for baccalaureate students. Upper division general education courses are only intended for baccalaureate students and should not be open to students who are not enrolled in the baccalaureate program.

The general education courses should provide course content that broadens the worldview of the student, be an integrative experience that relies upon and refines knowledge, abilities, and skills obtained via lower division and reflects current issues or trends in the field as appropriate.

Upper Division Major Requirements

Each baccalaureate program must identify a minimum of 18 semester units within the identified major for the baccalaureate degree. A major is defined as a single field of study from the Taxonomy of Programs (TOP). Colleges may determine that a lower division course meets the requirements for an identified upper division course requirement, but the minimum number of upper division units must still be completed.

LOWER DIVISION COURSES (100-299)

Breadth: students gain some understanding of the extent of a field or discipline; OR students learn how one field fits into or relates to other fields.

Foundation: students become acquainted with principles, terms, methods, and perspectives of a discipline or professional field, as a basis for more advanced or specialized study. Lower-division courses are those that majors are expected to complete in their first two years of study in the subject.

General education: students develop essential skills, attitudes, and practices (e.g., basics of critical thinking, numeracy, communication, problem solving) important in many different fields of higher education (e.g., lower-division Core) and perhaps in everyday life.

Preparation: lower-division courses may assume some basic entry-level knowledge, such as high school preparation in the field.

UPPER DIVISION COURSES (300-499)

Depth/Focus: students make in-depth study of a discipline's theories and methods, developing an understanding of the applications and limitations of those theories. Assignments should incorporate problem-solving, analytical thinking skills, and theoretical applications.

Specialization: students develop specific intellectual and professional abilities that will enable them to succeed or progress in a particular field or professional practice.

Refinement: students build upon the "general education" background noted above, applying these skills more discerningly or in more challenging contexts. Student will create or construct innovative approaches to problem solving generated by assigned topics.

Preparation: prerequisites may include more general courses, student class standing, GPA requirements, or admission to a pre-professional program. Thus, majors and minors generally take upper-division courses in their junior and senior years.

A note on upper division general education courses: These courses, though not necessarily specialized or focused on in-depth study of one discipline, have an integrative function. Because one of the primary goals of these courses is to integrate knowledge gained from earlier studies, these are necessarily offered at the upper-division level and limited to juniors and seniors or, in some cases, seniors only.

Numbering of Courses

Cypress College numbers courses as follows:

- 1. 100 199: Freshman or First-year Courses
- 2. 200 299: Sophomore or Second-year Courses
- 3. 300 399: Junior or Third-year Courses
- 4. 400 499: Senior or Fourth-year Courses

Cypress College courses that are applicable to the associate degree but not applicable to baccalaureate degrees are numbered 0 - 99.

Upper Division SLOs & Course Objectives- Critical Thinking Verbs

It is recommended that Cypress College faculty define the SLOs and course objectives utilizing higher level critical thinking verbs.

Taxonomy of Programs and Classification of Instructional Programs

All baccalaureate degrees must have an identified code from the Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP). Those codes are located at: https://nces.ed.gov/ipeds/cipcode/Default.aspx?y=55.

All degrees offered by a California community college must also identify the appropriate code from the Taxonomy of Programs (TOP).

BACKGROUND: Revised 2015-2016 fiscal year allocations and amendments have been received for various federal- and state-funded programs. - Center for Applied Competitive Technologies California Manufacturing Technology Association training Grant (CACT-CMTA)
- Federal Work Study (FWS)
- Science Technology Engineering & Math (STEM) Grant
- Staff Diversity Funds

The Child Care Fund program requiring an adjustment are:

• Quality Rating & Improvement System Block Grant (QRIS)

The Financial Aid Fund programs requiring an adjustment are:

- Full-Time Student Success Grant (FTSSG)
- Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG).

How does this relate to the five District Strategic Directions? This item responds to Direction #4: The District will implement best practices related to planning including: transparent decision-making processes, support of strategic and comprehensive planning activities at campus and District levels, and the allocation of resources to fund planning priorities; and Direction #5: The District will develop and sustain collaborative projects and partnerships with the community's educational institutions, civic organizations, and businesses.

Reference:

Government Code Section 53600 et seq.

- Investment Philosophy: It is the policy of the North Orange County Community College District ("District") to invest surplus monies not required for immediate necessities available in all District funds, in a manner which will provide the maximum security of principal invested with secondary emphasis on achieving the highest yield while meeting the daily cash flow needs of the District and conforming to all applicable State and County statutes governing the investment of public funds.
 - 1.1 All District funds adhere to this policy, with the exception of the Other Post Employment Benefit Irrevocable Trust, that was established to fund retiree health benefits, and that is governed by a separate Investment Policy Statement which is available on the District website.
- 2.0 **Objectives**: The primary objectives, in priority order, of the District's investment activities shall be:
 - 2.1 <u>Safety of Principal</u>: Safety of principal is the foremost objective of the District. Investments shall be undertaken in a manner that seeks to ensure the preservation of capital in the overall portfolio.
 - 2.2 <u>Liquidity</u>: Liquidity is the second most important objective of the District. The District's investments will be sufficiently liquid to enable it to meet all operating requirements that might be reasonably anticipated. "Liquidity" refers to the ability to sell at any given moment with a minimal chance of losing some portion of principal or interest.
 - 2.3 <u>Yield</u>: Yield is the third most important objective of the District. The District's investments shall be designed to attain a short-term current market rate of return throughout budgetary and economic cycles.

3.0 **Delegation of Authority**:

- 3.1 The Board of Trustees of the North Orange County Community College District ("the Board") is responsible for establishing the investment policy and ensuring investments are made in compliance with this policy. The Investment Committee is charged with the responsibility of renewing the investment policy and recommending modifications to the Board.
- 3.2 The Board of Trustees delegates investment authority to the Vice Chancellor Finance and Facilities for a one-year term. Subject to review, this delegation may be renewed pursuant to this section each year. The Chancellor is ultimately responsible for compliance with this policy. The District may employ the services of a Registered Investment Advisor ("Advisor") for implementing the policy. This policy will be reviewed and approved at least annually by the Board.

4.0 **Prudence**:

4.1 The standard of prudence to be used in the investment function shall be the "prudent investor" standard and shall be applied in the context of managing the

overall portfolio. This standard states "investment shall be made with judgment and care, under circumstances then prevailing, which persons of prudence, discretion, and intelligence exercise in the management of their own affairs, not for speculation, but for investment, considering the safety of their capital as well as the expected income to be derived."

- 4.2 The Chancellor, Vice Chancellor Finance & Facilities, or the Advisor, acting in accordance with written procedure and this policy, shall not be held personally liable for a specific security's credit risk or market price change, provided that any unexpected deviations are reported in a timely manner and that appropriate action is taken to control adverse developments.
- 5.0 Ethics and Conflicts of Interest: Trustees, employees and investment officials involved in the investment process shall refrain from personal business activity that could conflict with proper execution of the investment program, or which could impair their ability to make impartial investment decisions. Trustees, employees and investment officials shall disclose any material financial interests in financial institutions that conduct business within this jurisdiction, and they shall further disclose any large personal financial/investment position that could be related to the performance of the District's portfolio.
- 6.0 **Authorized Investments**: To the extent not inconsistent with the objectives stated above and Investment Restrictions outlined below, all monies shall be invested according to the following guidelines:
 - 6.1 <u>Fund Segmentation:</u> Given the various natures of the Fund's obligations, a certain portion of the Fund should be allocated to a short duration/maturity fixed income portfolio while the remainder should be invested with an objective of higher, longer-term returns. The Fund's allocation to the short duration/maturity fixed income portfolio should be conservatively based on an actuarial assessment of the Fund's expected cash needs for withdrawals and benefits. The Chancellor, Vice Chancellor Finance and Facilities and the Board should review this allocation at least annually. Guidelines and restrictions for each approved investment portion are described below.
 - 6.2 <u>Maximum Maturity</u>. Restrictions of the maximum maturity will vary on the different styles employed:
 - 6.2.1 <u>Short Duration/Maturity Fixed Income</u>: Investments in the short duration/maturity portfolio are subject to a maximum stated term of three years. Term or tenure shall mean the remaining time to maturity when purchased.
 - 6.2.2 <u>Core Fixed Income</u>: Investments in the core fixed income style are restricted to five year terms to maturity. Term or tenure shall mean the remaining time to maturity when purchased.
 - 6.3 Permitted Investments:

- 6.3.1 <u>State of California Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF)</u>: LAIF is a pooled fund managed by the State Treasurer whose permitted investments are identified in the Government Code Section 16429.2.
- 6.3.2 <u>Orange County Investment Pool (OCIP)</u>: Orange County Treasury Investment Pool is managed by the Orange County Treasurer whose permitted investments are identified in Government Code 53600, et.seq.
- 6.3.3 <u>U.S. Treasuries</u>: United States Treasury notes, bonds, bills, or certificates of indebtedness, for which the full faith and credit of the United States are pledged for the payment of principal and interest.
- 6.3.4 <u>Federal Agencies</u>: Obligations, participations, or other instruments, including those issued by or guaranteed as to principal and interest by federal agencies or United States government-sponsored enterprises.
- 6.3.5 <u>Corporate Notes</u>: Corporate and depository institution debt securities issued by corporations organized and operating within the United States or depository institutions licensed by the United States or any state and operating within the United States. Notes eligible for investment under this subdivision shall be rated "A" or better. The maximum remaining maturity shall be five years or less and shall not exceed 30% of the District's investments. Furthermore, no more than 10% is to be invested in any one company.
- 6.3.6 <u>Asset-Backed Securities</u>: Any mortgage pass-through security, collateralized mortgage obligation, or other pay through bond, equipment lease-backed certificate, or consumer receivable pass-through certificate, consumer receivable back bond. Securities eligible for investment under this subdivision shall be issued by an issuer having an "A" or higher rating for the issuer's debt as provided for by a nationally recognized rating service. For maturity purposes the average life of the securities return of principal will be used as the implied maturity and will not exceed five years. The investments shall not exceed 20% of the District's investments.
- 6.3.7 Commercial Paper: Commercial paper of "prime" quality of the highest ranking or of the highest letter and number rating as provided for by a nationally recognized statistical-rating organization (NRSRO). The entity that issues the commercial paper shall meet all of the following conditions: (1) Is organized and operating in the United States as a general corporation, (2) has total assets in excess of five hundred million dollars (\$500,000,000), and (3) has debt other than commercial paper, if any, that is rated "A" or higher by a nationally recognized statistical-rating organization; or (1) Is organized within the United States as a special purpose corporation, trust, or limited liability company, (2) has programwide credit enhancements including, but not limited to, overcollateralization, letters of credit, or surety bond, and (3) has commercial paper that is rated "A-1" or higher, or the equivalent, by a nationally recognized statistical-rating organization (NRSRO). Eligible paper shall have a maximum maturity of 270 days or less. The District shall not invest

more than 25% of their money in eligible commercial paper. Furthermore, the District shall not purchase more than 10% of the outstanding commercial paper of any single issuer.

- 6.3.8 <u>Negotiable Certificates of Deposit</u>: Negotiable certificates of deposit issued by a nationally or state-chartered bank or state or federal association with total assets of at least one billion dollars or by a state-licensed branch of a foreign bank, provided such foreign bank is one of the 75 largest foreign banks in terms of total assets. The investments shall not exceed 30% of the District's investments.
- 6.3.9 Repurchase Agreements: Investments in repurchase agreements (pursuant to section 53601(i) "repurchase agreement") means a purchase of securities pursuant to an agreement by which the seller will repurchase the securities on or before a specified date and for a specified amount and will deliver the underlying securities to the District by book entry, physical delivery, or by third party custodial agreement. The term of repurchase agreements shall be for one year or less. The term "securities" for the purposes of repurchase agreements shall mean securities issued or guaranteed by the U.S. Government and its agencies or instrumentalities. The Investment Restrictions enumerated below shall further limit such securities. With respect to any repurchase agreement the District will require the seller to maintain the market value of such securities that underlie the repurchase agreement at 102% of the repurchase price (including accrued interest). Furthermore, the investments provided should have certain standards of qualifications (i.e. the highest short-term rating or AA rating).
- 6.3.10 <u>Bankers Acceptances</u>: Known as bills of exchange or time drafts that are drawn on and accepted by a commercial bank. Purchases of bankers acceptances may not exceed 180 days maturity or 40 percent of the District's money that may be invested pursuant to this section. However, no more than 10 percent of the District's money may be invested in the bankers acceptances of any one commercial bank pursuant to this section.
- 6.3.11 <u>Money Market Fund</u>: Shares of beneficial interest issued by diversified management companies that are money market funds registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission under the Investment Company Act of 1940.
- 6.3.12 If additional types of securities are approved for investment by public funds by State Statute, they will not be eligible for investment by the District until this policy is amended and the amendment is passed by the Board. (Calif. Govt. Code Sect 53600, et.seq.)
- 6.4 <u>Investment Restrictions And Prohibited Transactions</u>. The following types of transactions are restricted or prohibited:
 - 6.4.1 Borrowing for investment purposes ("Leverage") is prohibited.

- 6.4.2 Reverse Repurchase Agreements, as defined by California Government Code Sections 53601(i) and 53636(i) or otherwise are prohibited.
- 6.4.3 The District shall not invest in instruments known as Structured Notes (e.g. inverse floaters, range notes, mortgage-derived, interest-only strips, leveraged floaters, structured certificate, or deposit, equity-linked securities) or any security that could result in zero interest accrual if held to maturity. Investment in any instrument which is commonly considered a "derivative" instrument (e.g. options, futures, swaps, caps, floors, collars) is prohibited.
- 6.4.4 No more than 10% of total assets may be invested in securities of any one issuer with the exception of LAIF, the OCIP or obligations of the U.S. Government and its agencies or instrumentalities.
- 6.4.5 All investments will be U.S. dollar denominated.
 - 6.4.6 Securities that are downgraded below the minimum acceptable rating levels should be reviewed for possible sale within a reasonable amount of time following a downgrade.
- 7.0 **Diversification**: It is the policy of the District to diversify its investment portfolio. Within each investment style, invested funds shall be diversified to minimize the risk of loss resulting from over concentration of assets in a specific maturity, specific issuer, or specific class of securities. Diversification strategies shall be established and periodically reviewed. At a minimum, diversification standards by security type and issuer shall be:

possible, will attempt to match investments with anticipated cash flow requirements. Matching maturities with cash flow dates will reduce the need to sell securities prior to maturity, thus reducing market risk.

8.0 Authorized Financial Dealers And Institutions:

- 8.1 The Chancellor, Vice Chancellor Finance and Facilities, or Investment Advisor may place orders for the execution of transactions with or through such brokers, dealers, banks and repurchase agreement counterparties as may be selected from an approved list of broker/dealers.
- 8.2 The District or the Advisor shall maintain a list of broker/dealers that are authorized to provide investment services to the District. Institutions shall provide their most recent "Consolidated Report of Condition" (call report) at the request of the District. At a minimum, the District or the Advisor shall conduct an annual evaluation of each institution's creditworthiness to determine whether it should be on the "Qualified Institution" listing.

9.0 **Performance Evaluation**:

- 9.1 The investment portfolio shall be designed with the objective of obtaining a rate of return throughout budgetary and economic cycles commensurate with the investment risk constraints and the cash flow needs of the District.
- 9.2 The District shall maintain an active investment strategy. Given this strategy, the basis used by the Vice Chancellor Finance and Facilities to determine whether market yields are being achieved shall be to identify a comparable benchmark upon establishing the structure of the portfolio.

10.0 Reporting:

- 10.1 The Chancellor, Vice Chancellor Finance and Facilities, and the Advisor shall submit a monthly list of transactions to the Board of Trustees and quarterly reports to the Investment Committee and the Board of Trustees. The quarterly report shall state compliance of the portfolio to the statement of investment policy or the manner in which the portfolio is not in compliance.
- 10.2 The monthly reports shall include the type of investment, issuer, date of maturity, par and dollar amount invested on all securities, market value as of the date of the report, and shall include the source of this same valuation.
- 11.0 **Safekeeping and Custody**: All funds managed by an investment advisor shall be held by a third party custodian. All security transactions, including collateral for repurchase agreements, entered into by the District shall be conducted on a delivery-versus-payment (DVP) basis. All securities will be held by a third-party custodian except for LAIF, OCIP and money market fund because these securities are not deliverable. The Treasurer shall maintain evidence of delivery. Securities shall be held by a third party custodian designated by and approved by the Investment Committee. The third party custodian shall be required to issue a safekeeping statement to the District listing the specific instrument, rate, maturity and other pertinent information.
- 12.0 **Collateralization**: In order to anticipate market changes and provide a level of additional

security for all funds, collateralization shall be required on the following types of investments:

- 12.1 <u>Repurchase Agreements</u>: For repurchase agreements, the minimum collateralization level shall be 102% of the market value of principal and accrued interest.
- 13.0 **Bond Proceeds**: The investment of bond proceeds shall be governed by the bond documents relevant to each specific bond issuance and the County Investment Policy Statement. If the bond documents are silent as to permitted investments, then this policy shall govern the investment of bond proceeds. In such case, Guaranteed Investment Contracts (GICs) shall be deemed permitted investments, solely for the purpose of bond proceeds and shall be limited in the following manner (1) investment agreements with providers with claims-paying, financial strength, or whose obligations are fully guaranteed by a company, rated at least "AA-" and "Aa3" by S&P and Moody's, respectively or (2) collateralized investment agreements with providers with claims-paying, financial strength, or whose obligations are fully guaranteed by a company, rated at least "A-" and "A3" by S&P and Moody's, respectively.
